WHO WE ARE

Data Driven Detroit (D3) provides accessible, high-quality information and analysis to drive informed decision-making that strengthens communities in Southeast Michigan. D3 was launched in 2009 with funding from The [Skillman Foundation](#) and The [Kresge Foundation](#). D3 incorporates features of “neighborhood data systems” that currently operate in many cities across the country. These systems encourage the direct and practical use of data, with the ultimate goal of improving the quality of life for residents in distressed urban neighborhoods. Championed by the [Urban Institute](#), such systems are the backbone of the [National Neighborhood Indicators Partnership \(NNIP\)](#), a highly regarded consortium of organizations dedicated to the democratization of data. In October 2009, D3 became an NNIP member. As a “one-stop shop” for data about the city of Detroit and the metro area, D3 promotes thoughtful community building and effective policymaking.

WHAT WE DO

The following are 2 of the many projects D3 is involved in that supports community involvement in the new Council District System and neighborhood revitalization.

Detroit City Council by District: Until recently, Detroit City Council has been elected at-large. However, the revised City Charter dictates that Council elections transition to a by-district system. D3 supported the public process of creating districting plans by (a) providing demographic data to the City Planning Commission, and (b) proposing its own district map, Option 5, as a neighborhood-centric alternative to the maps drafted by the City Planning Commission. We support community involvement by providing pertinent data, mapping, analysis, a [resource webpage](#) and a [newsletter article](#). We feel strongly that neighborhoods, communities, and place-based initiatives should not be adversely divided by political boundaries, see our [Power Lines](#) article. Community Development Advocates of Detroit Neighborhood Revitalization Strategic Framework: Community Development Advocates of Detroit’s (CDAD) Strategic Framework draws on the power of Detroit residents to shape their own neighborhoods. The Strategic Framework helps you turn the neighborhood you see today into the place you want it to be tomorrow. The CDAD Strategic Framework process consists of public exercises to help residents and other community stakeholders envision the future directions of their neighborhood, describe that vision, and achieve it. Starting in 2010, Data Driven Detroit (D3) was CDAD’s technical partner during the development of the strategic framework process. D3 supported CDAD by operationalizing and visualizing the typologies of the Strategic Framework. D3 presented the data as a tool to inform (not direct) community-based decisions.

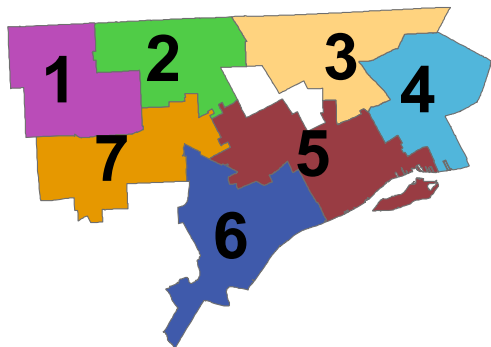
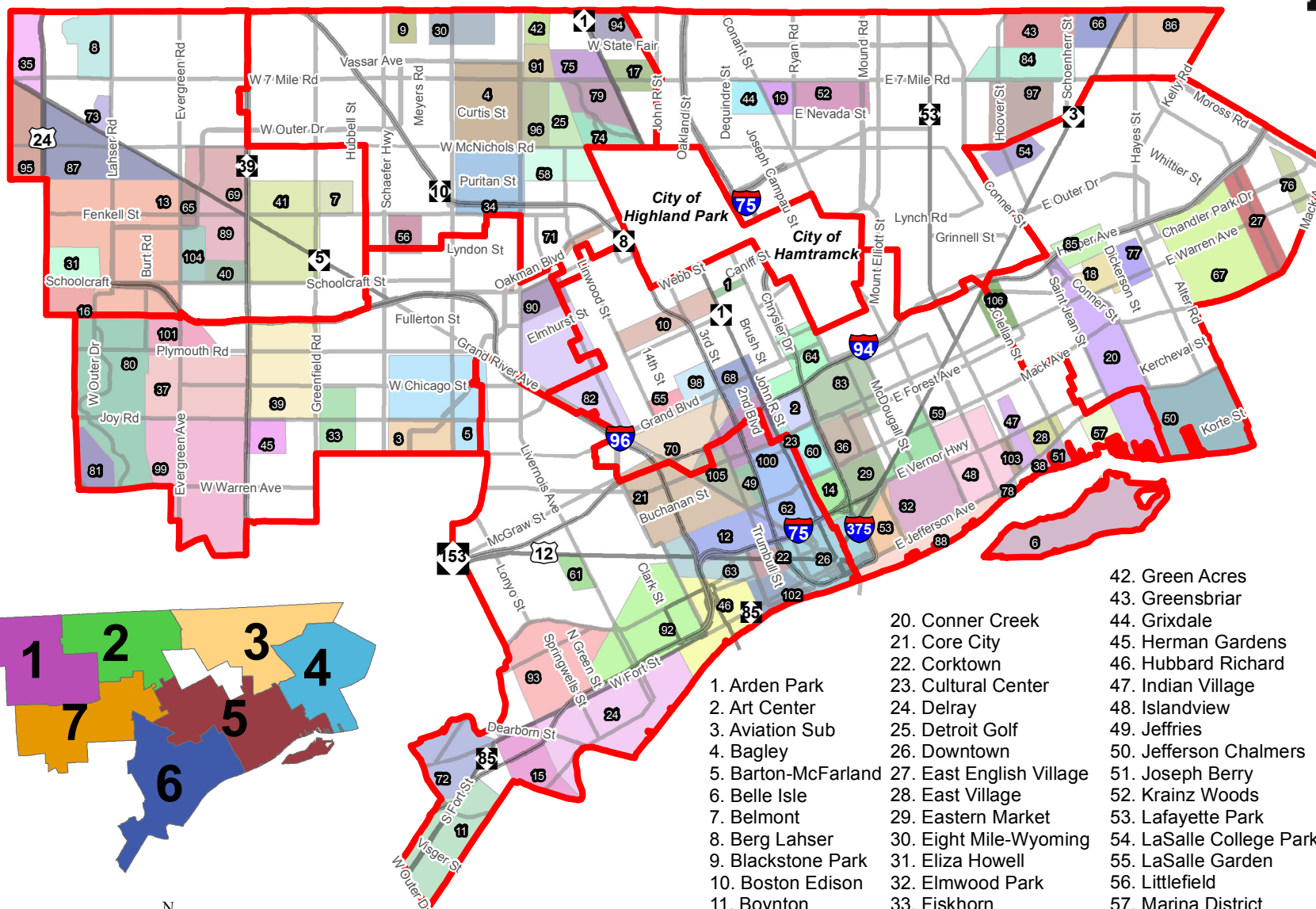
