This profile combines data from multiple census tracts following Census Bureau methods for calculating estimates and margins of error. Estimates and margins of error displayed here are rounded.

The CV, or coefficient of variation, is a measure of reliability on a scale starting at zero, with lower numbers indicating higher reliability. If an estimate has a green CV (0 - 12), it has high reliability. A yellow CV (12.1 - 40) signals medium reliability. A red CV (40.1 - 100+) signals low reliability. Data with low reliability should be used with caution.

From the Census Bureau:

Data are based on a sample and are subject to sampling variability. The degree of uncertainty for an estimate arising from sampling variability is represented through the use of a margin of error. The value shown here is the 90 percent margin of error. The margin of error can be interpreted roughly as providing a 90 percent probability that the interval defined by the estimate minus the margin of error and the estimate plus the margin of error (the lower and upper confidence bounds) contains the true value. In addition to sampling variability, the ACS estimates are subject to nonsampling error (for a discussion of nonsampling variability, see Accuracy of the Data). The effect of nonsampling error is not represented in these tables.
